
High-quality Assessment Alignment Modules



(PAEMST) is the highest recognition that a kindergarten through 12th grade mathematics or science (including computer science) teacher may receive for outstanding teaching in the United States. On August 22, 2016, President Obama recognized 213 educators including four Core Advocates, as recipients of this prestigious award. Each educator receives \$10,000 and is invited to a recognition ceremony at the White House on September 8, 2016. 

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
